Adored church and pastor, God bless each of you greatly. My wife and I are grateful to the Lord that you are always a part of our ministry in your support and prayers. I hope that your churches, families, and services to the Lord are being blessed by Him greatly.

I would like to give you the report of January and show you all that what God has been doing these days. First, let's start with camp, which was the first week of the month. We had a good group that went from our church, approximately 21 of us. That camp was a great blessing to each one of the young people. They didn't want to return home because many of them were filled by the Holy Spirit; the fellowship and everything they experienced in Sabana Grande made it a great experience for them.

Because of the revival we have seen in their lives, God put it in my heart to start a series of teachings on Friday's. We have divided the men and women to give a better concentration on the Word of God. We give thanks for this series as it has brought blessings like some confirming their faith and four girls getting saved: Andrea, Stephanie, Alessandra, and Nahomy. Alessandro and Billy want to obey in the following step of Baptism.

The classes are taught by family that is full time with them, the Munguia Orellana family, Sister Genesis and my wife teach the girls, while Brother Noe with Brother Isaias teach the young people. We have experienced growth and interest in our teens, which is why we also are continuing with youth services. We had about 26 youth come out on Saturday at Youth Service. I'm glad to see that they want to give their lives to God more and more.





The church services are going well; the brothers and sisters in Christ continue growing in their spiritual lives. We had seven people get saved in Evangelism; with the youth 4 more got saved and with the invitation of this last Sunday two more people, Flecher and Cindy, who gave their lives to God. Flecher and his girlfriend like Jose and Fernanda, other youth, have joined the discipleship classes with Brother Roberto and his wife Sunday afternoons.

We have approximately 80-90 in our church every Sunday; our goal is to reach 100 to keep growing after that.
